## Accessibility A Guide To Voting Options For Everyone



### Who can vote?

You can vote if you:

- Are a Canadian citizen;
- Are at least 18 years of age on election day; and
- Have lived in Manitoba for at least six months immediately before election day.

### How do I get my name on the voters list?

- An Elections Manitoba enumerator will visit your home to add your name to the voters list. Enumerators will have homebound voting applications. Enumeration takes place from February 4 to March 7.
- You can also contact your returning officer to be added to the list. To find your returning office, visit the Elections Manitoba website or download our mobile app.

- If you don't get your name added to the voters list, you can still vote. Just bring one piece of government issued photo ID (such as a driver's licence) or two other pieces of ID with you to the voting place.

### When can I vote?

You have a choice.

**ADVANCE VOTING** – You can vote from **April 9 to 16** at any advance voting place. Bring one piece of government-issued photo ID, or two other pieces of ID.

OR

**ELECTION DAY** – You can vote on election day, **Tuesday, April 19**, at your designated voting place in your electoral division.



## Elections Manitoba is committed to accessibility for all Manitoba voters

### Services & Voting Options

- **Homebound voting** – If you are unable to go in person to a voting place due to a disability, you and/or your caregiver can apply to vote in your home.
- **Curbside voting** – If you are unable to go inside the voting place because of a disability, a voting officer will bring the ballot box to your vehicle.
- **Braille ballot templates** and a **Braille list of candidates** is available at all voting places.
- **Magnifying lenses** and a **large-print list of candidates** are available from the voting officer.
- **Assistance** – You can bring someone with you to help you vote. They must be 18 years of age or older. A voting officer may also assist you.
- **Translation services** – A translator is available by telephone at all voting places. Contact your returning officer in advance to arrange for this service.

- **Personal security protection** – You can apply to have your personal information omitted or blacked out from the voters list to protect your personal security.
- **No permanent address** – You can vote if you do not have a permanent home. You can bring a letter to the voting place from a shelter or an agency saying they know who you are, along with one piece of ID.

**Wherever possible, voting places are accessible to voters with disabilities.**
